ASSISTANT RESEARCHER
in the Institute of European Studies
at the Faculty of International and Political Studies

within the scope of research project Horizon 2020 „EU3D. EU Differentiation, Dominance and Democracy”

For the post of assistant researcher may apply persons who fulfil requirements stated in Article 113, 116 (2) (4) of the Act of 20th July 2018 Law on higher education and science and meet the following qualification requirements:

- hold the degree of magister, magister inżynier or an equivalent degree in one of the relevant academic fields: political science, comparative studies, IR, political sociology, European studies,
- prepared an outstanding magister degree thesis confirmed by opinion of academic tutor or doctoral thesis confirmed by high grade,
- English language proficiency is required. If you are not a native English speaker, or if the language of instruction at your previous university was not English, we will ask you to provide evidence of strong English language skills. Please include English language test results in your application if this applies to you. English language tests should not be more than two years old at the time of application (at least C1 or equivalent).
- knowledge of additional EU official languages and ability to conduct parliamentary discourse analysis in them is essential,
- fluency in software for Qualitative Discourse Analysis (QDAMiner, MAXQDA; IRAMUTEQ etc.).
- strong academic record,
- previous experience and publications in the research areas of the EU3D project would be an advantage.

Job description: The Institute for European Studies of the Jagiellonian University in Kraków invites applications for a research assistant position on ‘Future of Europe proposals’ as part of the Horizon 2020 research Project “EU Differentiation, Dominance, Democracy”. Applicants should hold a MA in political science, sociology or a related social science discipline. The research project “EU3D. EU Differentiation, Dominance and Democracy” (#EU3D) gathers 10 partner academic institutions and think tanks (ARENA, Oslo University; Breugel Belgium; ELIAMEP Greece; Comenius University in Bratislava; Jagiellonian University Kraków, LUISS School of Governance Rome; Science Po Grenoble; University of Copenhagen; University of Konstanz and Oxford University). It will study the future of political integration in Europe. Its main objective is to develop and apply to the EU and beyond a theory of differentiation that specifies the conditions under which differentiation is politically acceptable, institutionally sustainable and democratically legitimate, and the conditions under which it is not. An offered position will be within research task on “Parliamentary debates and reform proposals” that will focus on comparative analysis of parliamentary debates in selected member states and on European level and undertake a comprehensive and systematic assessment of these in line with the analytical framework.

Responsibilities:

- Scientific and desk research on the parliamentary debates on future of Europe;
- Planning and realizing various research initiatives (debates transcripts; database building; interviews; reporting etc.);
- Maintaining empirical data;
- Contribution to project coordination and management;
- Communication with local and international stakeholders;
- Organising events.

Length of contract and % of full-time: The position is full time and announced for a period of 3 years without teaching obligations.

Candidates who apply for the post are required to file in the office of the Center of European Studies, the Jagiellonian University; 31-131 Kraków, ul. Garbarska 7a, room 2, the following documents:

1. A one-page letter of motivation.
2. Curriculum vitae with full summary of education, practice, academic and non-academic work experience, language proficiency, positions of trust, and other qualifying/extra-curricular activities,
3. Personal questionnaire,
4. Copy of magister degree diploma or doctoral diploma,
5. If applicable - list of publications (including publishing house and number of pages),
6. Two letters of recommendation,
7. Form of the latest interim evaluation, if a candidate was evaluated,
8. Statement declaring that Jagiellonian University will be the basic place of employment in the case of being employed in the competition procedure.
9. Statement – in accordance with Article 113 of the Act Law on higher education and science.
10. Statement regarding acquaintance and acceptance of intellectual property rules as well as legal protection of intellectual property.
11. Information regarding personal data processing.
